MCFC Costume Contest Rules

- All contestants must have made or significantly altered at least 60% of their costume to be eligible for a major craftsmanship award. Store bought or commissioned costumes will not be eligible for a craftsmanship prize, but may be awarded an exhibition or judges award.
- Children 12 and under are not required to make the majority of their costume, but if they assisted in its construction, that information should be presented at the time of pre-judging
- All contestants must be a registered attendee of Memphis Comic and Fantasy Con.
- Any genre of costume is welcome.
- All entrants are asked to bring the following:
 - 1. A completed cosplay contest entry form. If entering as a group, all members names must be listed. Forms will be available at the convention.
 - A reference picture of the character being portrayed, preferably a color print. Hand drawn images will not be accepted unless the costume is an original design. A reference image is required for the judges to properly score entries. Do not assume that the judges will know all characters being presented.
 - 3. All children 12 and under must be accompanied by a parent/guardian at all times during pre-judging and the stage presentation.
- No costume is no costume. Please remember that Memphis Comic and Fantasy
 Con is a family friendly convention, and all costumes should reflect that. Any
 costume with less coverage than a full backed bikini will not be allowed to
 compete. If you have a question about your costume's eligibility, please email
 mehdiaraiise@qmail.com with photos of the costume for approval.

- No skits allowed due to time restrictions.
- No real weapons will be allowed in the competition or inside Memphis Comic and Fantasy Con. Any prop gun that has the ability to fire cannot be loaded or fired during the presentation. If a sword is carried, it must stay sheathed at all times.
- Live animals will not be allowed to participate, with the exception of seeingeye dogs if required by the contestant.
- Electrical power connections will not be provided. If your costume requires power, it must be part of your costume design.
- Any contestant with a larger costume may bring a handler to assist if necessary.
- Each participant will have a chance to show off their costume in a catwalk style presentation. To participate, each contestant must register and be prejudged. Failure to do so will result in disqualification from the contest.
- An entrant may enter the competition using a model. The entrant must be present at the time of judging and state that the person wearing the costume is a model, not the creator. Only one modeled costume per entrant.
- Judges may inspect the construction of each costume closely. Please inform them at the time of registration if you are not comfortable with this.
- The contest director reserves the right to exclude any costume from the show that he/she deems inappropriate or for any reason deemed to be sufficient.
- Any costume that has won a Major award (i.e. Best in Show, Best Group, or Best Master) in another competition may not be entered into the contest.

Dismissal and Disqualification: Don't Let it Happen to You!

While it is MCFC's policy to try to reach an amicable solution to any challenges during the Cosplay Contest, the department does maintain certain conditions in which a contestant may become disqualified, banned from future competitions, and escorted off of the convention floor.

- Contestants who are found to have purposely misled the judges on either the
 construction of their costume or on their level of experience and skill in order
 to compete in a lower-division will be immediately disqualified. In the cases
 where this is not discovered until after the competition has ended, the
 contestant will be banned from participating in future MCFC Cosplay Contests.
- Contestants who are found to have presented a commissioned costume or a store-bought, mass-produced costume as a constructed costume will be immediately disqualified. In the cases where this is not discovered until after the competition has ended, the contestant will be banned from participating in future MCFC Cosplay Contests.
- Any contestant who displays nudity on stage during the Cosplay Contest will be disqualified and dismissed.
- Contestants who make profane, political, religious or any other disruptive statements, including through the use of signage or clothing, during the Cosplay Contest will be disqualified and dismissed.
- Any contestant displaying physical or verbally abusive behavior to any MCFC
 Staff members and volunteers, judges, other competitors, or convention
 attendees will be disqualified, dismissed from the Cosplay Contest, and banned
 from future competitions. Extremely serious infractions will result in having
 convention membership revoked and being escorted off the premises.

- Any contestant who fires a projectile from the stage during the Cosplay Contest will be disqualified.
- Contestants are discouraged from performing any acrobatics on stage for safety reasons. This includes but is not limited to flips, kicks, and high jumps.
 Performing a maneuver that was not approved by the MCFC Director may result in a disqualification.
- The use of explosive devices is expressly prohibited. The use of one by a contestant will result in disqualification and dismissal from the Cosplay Contest.
- Contestants who are visibly intoxicated will not be allowed to participate in the Cosplay Contest. Any contestant found to be intoxicated during the contest will be dismissed and disqualified.
- The Director and other executive level MCFC staff maintain the right to dismiss and disqualify contestants for reasons that are not expressly listed here.

Description of Categories

<u>MASTER</u>: Professional creators or anyone who has won at least five major awards in contests. Anyone may enter, regardless of number of past awards.

<u>JOURNEYMAN</u>: Anyone who has won at least one, but no more than five major contest awards.

<u>NOVICE</u>: Anyone who has never won an award in a contest.

<u>YOUTH</u>: Ages 13-17 may enter and need to have made/helped make or modified at least parts of their costumes.

<u>KIDS 12 & UNDER</u>: These competitors don't have to have crafted any of their costume, but it should be pointed out if they did.

PROP/ARMOR: This can be a focus on a single item or armor crafted by the entrant.

<u>WIG/MAKEUP</u>: This can be a focus on wig styling or detailed makeup done by the entrant.

<u>EXHIBITION</u>: Anyone wishing to show off their bought, commissioned, or closet cosplay. This will be judged on presence and how much the entrant embodies their character.

<u>JUDGES AWARDS</u>: The judges can choose a winner from any category as their personal pick.
